Dear Mr. Sargsyan,

On April 30th, 2025, the Judicial Hearing took place to review allegations that the Theta Delta Chi Fraternity violated the IFC Bylaws with incidents on or around June 1st 2024. Based on the totality of the information available and disclosed during the hearing, the Panel of Associate Justices found sufficient evidence to find the fraternity responsible for the alleged incidents pertaining to IFC Risk Management Policies: Section 7, Subsection 6.1.i. (Advertising on Social Media); Section 11, Subsection 2.3.a. (Event Registration). The following sanctions have been decided by the Panel of Associate Justice:

**1. Disciplinary Probation:** For the rest of the Spring 2025 Quarter, Theta Delta Chi will be on disciplinary probation with the Interfraternity Council. Further violations of IFC Policies or Bylaws, referrals by UCPD, or violations of IFC sanctions will result in more severe sanctions for Theta Delta Chi.

**2. Written Documentation of Meeting With VP Of Risk Management:** Theta Delta Chi Executive Team must hold a workshop with the current VP of Risk Management (Will Holzier) to discuss IFC Policies within the Chapter. This workshop should discuss IFC Policy, including but not limited to, IFC Policies and Procedures, requirements of registered events, distinctions between philanthropy and social event policies, joint event policies, and proper event advertisement. This workshop must be attended by the current Executive Board of Theta Delta Chi, with the Risk Chair, Social Chair, President, and Vice President all being required in attendance. Please submit an outline of the discussion, as well as any information given out, with an attendance sheet, to the IFC Chief Justice by May 15th, 2025. If this meeting does not take place in the allotted time period, an In-House Event Restriction will apply until the presentation takes place. Extensions may be granted to accommodate scheduling and will be approved by the Chief Justice.

**3. Transparency of Philanthropic Events:** Future philanthropy events hosted by Theta Delta Chi for the remainder of the Spring Quarter, Effective immediately must include transparency of philanthropic purposes on all advertisements, fliers, and similar media. This includes the name of the charitable organization in which ticket sales/money proceeds go towards, and the inclusion of language pertaining to philanthropic purposes (ie: "charity", "donate", "philanthropy"). Further violations regarding the improper advertisement of Philanthropy events

may result in more severe sanctions.

**a. Philanthropic Donation Transparency:** Following philanthropy events hosted by the Theta Delta Chi Fraternity, a donation report is required to be sent to the Chief Justice within 1 week of the scheduled event date. The report is to contain the following:

1. The amount of money raised.
2. Operating costs associated with preparing/setting up the event.
3. Details regarding ticket sales and the number of people present at the event.
4. A receipt/invoice to the charitable organization advertised.

Should you want to follow up on the request, or need assistance moving forward please do not hesitate to ask. We appreciate your cooperation in closing this matter. If you have any concerns moving forward, please let us know.

If you should decide to appeal these sanctions, the request must be made within 5 business days of receiving this letter. The request should be sent to the Chief Justice and Richard Barreto.
